Parts of Speech

<u>1. Nouns:</u>

Nouns are words that identify a person, an animal, a place, a thing or an idea what makes of nouns one of the most important parts of speech.

They are known, also, as **abstract nouns**.

1.2. Common and Proper Nouns:

- Proper Nouns: are nouns that are special which are given for specific things. Therefore, they are always beginning with a capital letter, for example, Quran, Mercedes, Gibson. However, in other cases, proper nouns can contain two or more important words such as Big Ben, Central Park Zoo, World War Two.
- Common Nouns: are nouns that are general (not specific) or can belong to more than one item. For example, a kid, an ocean.... Since these nouns are not naming anything special (specific), they don't need to start with a capital letter unless they begin the sentence.
